


Light Lovers,

The lighthouse character was inspired by Palmido Island Lighthouse, which served as 'Korea's First Light,' signifying the connections from the past into the future of this high-tech city. With the Spotted Mulbeom mascot, Incheon City indicates its nature-friendly policies by adopting one of the local endangered species that are protected as Korea's Natural Monument.

Northeast Asia's International City Oriented towards the World

Incheon is on a constant process toward development and growth

As a hub city of Northeast Asia, Incheon is geographically located at the center of the Korean Peninsula. Modernized and yet retaining its traditional form, Incheon is a safe and pleasant city for all. As a marine city opening on the sea, Incheon offers wonderful views over the crystal blue sea and beautiful sunsets. Moreover, Incheon's warmhearted citizens welcome visitors based on traditions and sentiments absorbed in Korean society and culture.



28 km to/from Seoul (at the center of the Korean Peninsula)

The numeric location of Incheon is roughly 126°37′ E and 37°28′ N. At the center of the Korean Peninsula, touched by the Yellow Sea, Incheon is situated on the lower end of the Hangang River. Roughly 28 km from South Korea's capital, Seoul, Incheon sits around the same latitude as San Francisco, Washington D.C., and Southern Spain.

With land reclamation efforts beginning in 2000, Incheon was enlarged to 994.12 $\rm km^2$ in 2005, representing 1% of the total national area, and to 1.063.26 $\rm km^2$ as of December 31, 2019.



Continental and Oceanic Climate

Incheon belongs to the Continental Climate Zone, with some Oceanic Climate features in its coastal areas. Thus, compared with the inland provinces, its annual temperature range is relatively small. The annual average temperature is 12.1°C, with a record high of 38.9°C (August 16, 1949) and a record low of -21.0°C (January 11, 1931). The yearly precipitation is 1,134.4 mm, again relatively low compared with other regions on the same latitude.

Educational Environment for Fostering Talent

Incheon boasts infrastructure equipped with the best education programs.

Inha University carries over 60 years of tradition, serving as a cradle for fostering talented minds, while Incheon National University consistently welcomes excellent new students with its status as a national university. Yonsei University (with its International Campus in Songdo) and Incheon Global Campus regularly produce talented individuals with global-standard capabilities. Chadwick International Songdo, with its well-equipped educational infrastructure, operates K-12 curriculums, while Cheongna Dalton School also boasts a high-level education program and environment, along with swimming pools and a horse-riding course.



Inha University

As Incheon's representative private Korean university, Inha University is constituted of nine colleges, two undergraduate schools, 67 departments, and nine graduate schools covering diverse disciplinary courses, such as Engineering, Natural Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Social Science, Humanities, Medicine, Future Convergence, Arts & Sports, and Global Convergence Studies.

Incheon National University

Incheon National University is a national university founded in Yeonsu-gu, Incheon Metropolitan City, South Korea. In August 2009, the university moved from the Jemulpo Campus in Dohwa-dong, Michuholgu, to the Songdo Campus in Songdo-dong. Next, in March 2010, Incheon National University was incorporated with Incheon Technical University.

Yonsei University International Campus

Yonsei University is currently constructing an international campus on its 614,654 m² (186,000 pyeong) site in Songdo. The school has also adopted the Residential College (RC) program, an advanced exclusive education model that many world-renowned colleges overseas have long implemented.

Cheongna Dalton School

Cheongna Dalton School was established by the Korean school foundation when the Bongduk Education Foundation signed an MOU with the New York-based Dalton School on the 'Establishment of an International School.' The school was built on the progressive educational program known as the Dalton Plan, developed by Mrs. Helen Parkhurst in the early 20th century.
